Peter Richard Conte St. Matthew Lutheran Church, Hanover November 20, 2016

The St. Matthew Lutheran Church Concert Series will present Peter Richard Conte, the organist at Macy's (old Wanamaker's Store) in Philadelphia and the organist at Longwood Gar-



dens, in concert on Sunday, November 20 at 4:00 pm. Mr. Conte will be joined in several selections by Trumpeter / Flugelhornist Andrew Ennis. The church is located at 30 W. Chestnut Street, Hanover, PA. Free tickets are required for admission and can be ordered through November 10 by sending a stamped, self-addressed envelope to the attention of "November Concert" St. Matthew Lutheran Church, 30 W. Chestnut St., Hanover, PA 17331. Please note the number of tickets desired. A free-will offering will be taken to assist with the concert series costs. The doors open at 3:30 p.m. A reception will follow the program.

The program will include: Finlandia by Sibelius, Bernstein's Overture to Candide, Elmore's Fantasy on Nursery Tunes Respighi's Pines of the Appian Way, and Puccini's Nessum Dorma among other selections.

The St. Matthew Austin pipe organ is one of the ten largest pipe organs in the world. The new 2014 console operates over 230 stops and 14,000 pipes, plus the new digital and MIDI stops. The 198-bell Maas-Rowe carillon is playable from the console. Peter Richard Conte is celebrating his 25th year as Wanamaker Grand Court Organist. He is only the fourth person to hold that title since the organ first played in 1911. He performs concerts twice daily, six days each week, on the largest fully-functioning musical instrument in the world. Mr. Conte is also Principal Organist of Longwood Gardens, Kennett Square, PA, and, since 1991, has served as Choirmaster and Organist of Saint Clement's Church, Philadelphia, where he directs a professional choir in an extensive music program catering to the Anglo-Catholic tradition.

Mr. Conte is highly regarded as a skillful performer and arranger of organ transcriptions. Mr. Conte performs extensively throughout the United States and Canada under the management of Phillip Truckenbrod Concert Artists, and has appeared as a featured artist at American Guild of Organists' National and Regional Conventions.

Peter Richard Conte is an Adjunct Assistant Professor of Organ at Rider University's Westminster Choir College, Princeton, NJ, where he teaches Organ Improvisation. His numerous recordings appear on the GOTHIC, JAV, ProOrgano, DORIAN and DTR labels.

Andrew Ennis is a graduate of Rowan University where he received his undergraduate degree in music education, specializing in trumpet. While performing a wide variety of classical literature, he also enjoys jazz, and played lead trumpet in the Rowan jazz ensembles. In addition to his fulltime duties as the newly-appointed Orchestral Music teacher at the Collingswood, New Jersey Middle School, Mr. Ennis also serves as the Director of Instrumental Music and assistant pianist and organist at his Parish of St. Joachim in Bellmawr, NJ. Liturgical music is one of the most important aspects of his life.



I'm just coming off of Cloud Nine as I write this!! Last weekend, I experienced 2 excellent organ recitals in one weekend.

Friday, October 21, I traveled to Timonium, Maryland to hear organist Katelyn Emerson, play an exquisite program on a lovely all mechanical action organ at Epiphany Episcopal Church. Katelyn is the 2016 winner of the National Young Artists Competition in Organ Performance sponsored by the AGO. She played a beautiful program consisting of "early' music of Muffat, Sweelinck, Pachelbel, Bruhns and Bach and then music of Langlais, Mendelssohn and Brahms. The organ is a small two manual instrument with no pistons. The church organist and her son were both on hand to pull stops on and off for Katelyn. It was a marvelous sounding concert featuring flexible, meantone tuning and winding on the Richard Howell pipe organ.



Saturday, October 22, I made arrangements to meet with Richard Elliott, principal organist of the Mormon Tabernacle Choir at St. Matthew Lutheran Church in Hanover. I also invited Joseph and Roseanne Patterson, 2 of my organ students who are Mormon to meet Dr. Elliott. Joseph was invited to play for Dr. Elliott on the new organ console. Afterwards we went out to dinner and had some great conversation. The following afternoon, Richard played a marvelous and engaging organ program to a packed house audience! The monumental St. Matthew organ behemoth sounded with drama and fortitude. What a wonderful culmination of glorious organ music.

Charles-Marie Widor, Master of the Organ Symphony DVD presentation Part 1

St. Paul's Lutheran Church, 25 W. Springettsbury Ave, York, PA

Charles-Marie Widor (1844 – 1937), the most famous composer of organ music since Bach, wrote ten revolutionary organ symphonies that established the organ as a rival of the orchestra, pioneered the use of symphonic forms for the instrument, and sublimated influences as diverse as Bach's fugues, Wagner's music dramas and medieval plainchant into an original musical language. On top of this, he composed a Toccata that is probably the best-loved piece of organ music ever written.

This boxed set provides a complete portrait of this great composer. The centerpiece is a magnificent three-part documentary showing how Widor came to write his organ symphonies, how his compositional style developed and matured, and how these works fit into his overall career as a performer, teacher and writer. Presented by Gerard Brooks and featuring interviews with Widor scholars Daniel Roth, John Near and Anne-Isabelle de Parcevaux, this film also sets Widor's organ music in the context of his work as a mainstream composer of operas, ballets, chamber music and orchestral symphonies.

Widor's life was intertwined with that of the great French organ builder Aristide Cavaillé-Coll. Therefore Widor's greatest organ works are recorded in mesmerizing surround-sound on the three best surviving Cavaillé-Coll instruments, Saint-Sulpice in Paris, where Widor himself was organist for almost sixty years, Orléans Cathedral and Saint-Ouen in Rouen. Widor's fifth and sixth symphonies are included in their entirety on both CD and DVD, performed by Gerard Brooks. Daniel Roth, the current organist at Saint-Sulpice, performs a range of movements from the other symphonies.


