**THE ST. MATTHEW LUTHERAN CHURCH CONCERT SERIES** will present Simon Johnson in concert on Sunday, October 27 at 4:00 p.m. Mr. Johnson is the Organist of St. Paul's Cathedral in London, England. Free tickets are required for admission and can be ordered by sending a stamped, self-addressed envelope to: October Concert, St. Matthew Lutheran Church, 30 W. Chestnut St., Hanover, PA 17331. A free-will offering will be taken to assist with the concert costs. Please note the number of tickets desired. The doors open at 3:30 p.m. A reception will follow the program.

The program, sponsored by Mary Moore in memory of her daughter, Pamela Moore Closs, will include works by Parry, Bach, Stanford, Brewer, Widor, Durufle, Thalben-Ball and Walton. The program will be played on St. Matthew's 238 rank, 14,470-pipe Austin organ which is one of the ten largest pipe organs in the world. There will be a large screen and cameras to enable the audience to view the organist up close.

Simon Johnson has been the Organist of St Paul's Cathedral in London, England since 2008. During this time he has played for the daily round of

services as well as historical services and events. He has played for events with Her Majesty the Queen, the Dalai Lama, numerous Prime Ministers and Archbishops, and at all the state occasions that have taken place at St Paul's during his tenure.

Recitals have taken him all over the USA and Europe, including a Royal Festival Hall debut in 2017. Last year, St Paul's was sold out for his performance of Holst's *The Planets* with link-ups to NASA and the International Space Station. Forthcoming work includes two solo tours of the USA.

As a Director, Simon has played an important role in the Cathedral's ongoing partnerships with leading orchestras in London, conducting many significant works from the repertoire by Bach, Handel, Mozart, Bruckner, Saint-Saëns, Strauss, Gershwin, Poulenc, Duruflé and Messiaen. Previously he enjoyed a distinguished tenure as Director of St Albans Abbey Girls' Choir, leading them in several highly-acclaimed recordings and tours.

Simon's advice and analysis is sought worldwide: in 2018 he was a keynote speaker at the Pontificium Consilium de Cultura at the Vatican; he is presently Consultant for the new 4-manual Harrison and Harrison organ in St Jude's Cathedral, Lagos; and he is on the Academic Board of The Royal College of Organists, for whom he is also an examiner.

Simon has performed with groups such as the London Symphony Orchestra, Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, and The Sixteen, recorded for *Decca* and *Hyperion*, been published by OUP and Peters, and worked on the Oscar-winning soundtrack for *The Grand Budapest Hotel*.

### St. Matthew Lutheran Church to Present

#### **Organist Peter Richard Conte**

The St. Matthew Lutheran Church Concert Series will present Peter Richard Conte, the organist at Macy's (old Wanamaker's Store) in Philadelphia and the organist at Longwood Gardens, in concert on Sunday, November 17 at 4:00 pm. Mr. Conte will be joined in several selections by Trumpeter/Flugelhornist Andrew Ennis. The church is located at 30 W. Chestnut Street, Hanover, PA. Free tickets are required for admission and can be ordered from October 15- November 12 by sending a stamped, self-addressed envelope to the attention of "November Concert" St. Matthew Lutheran Church, 30 W. Chestnut St., Hanover, PA 17331. Please note the number of tickets desired. A free-will offering will be taken to assist with the concert series costs. The doors open at 3:30 p.m. A reception will follow the program.



The recently renovated St. Matthew Austin pipe organ is one of

the ten largest pipe organs in the world. The console operates over 230 stops and 14,470 pipes, plus the digital and MIDI stops. The 198-bell Maas-Rowe carillon is playable from the console. The organ has been played by many of the world's finest organists.

The colorful and exciting program will include works by Buxtehude, Puccini, Gounod, Kreisler, Strauss, Rimsky-Korsakov, Karg-Elert, Mendelssohn, and Stravinsky.

The nearly-unparalleled technical facility, brilliant ear for lush tonal color, and innovative programming style of **Peter Richard Conte** have made him one of the most revered and sought-after "orchestral" organists of this era. He was appointed Wanamaker Grand Court Organist in 1989–only the fourth person to hold that title since the organ first played in 1911 – where he presides over the world's largest fullyfunctioning musical instrument, at over 29,000 pipes, located at the Macy's Department Store in the heart of downtown Philadelphia. The organ is heard in recital twice daily, six days per week, with Mr. Conte playing a majority of the recitals. He is also one of the producers and lead artist in the popular Christmas holiday shows at Macy's and the annual Organ Day every June, each presenting truly grand music befitting of the vast space. Mr. Conte is also Principal Organist at Longwood Gardens in Kennett Square, PA, and since 1991, has served as Choirmaster and Organist of Saint Clement's Church, Philadelphia.

Mr. Conte is highly regarded as a skillful performer of the standard organ repertoire, arranger of orchestral and popular transcriptions, and silent film accompanist. His recitals can include such diverse works as Bernstein's *Overture to 'Candide'*, Dupré's *Symphonie Passion*, Mussorgsky's *Night on Bald Mountain*, "period pieces" such as *Londonderry Air*, and works by unknowns such as Firmin Swinnen and Oliphant Chuckerbutty. His numerous recordings appear on the Gothic, JAV, Pro Organo, Dorian, Raven, and DTR labels. His most recent CD, *Virgil Fox Remembered*, was released in May 2016 on the Raven label.

Peter Richard Conte frequently collaborates with flugelhornist and organist **Andrew Ennis**. Mr. Ennis is an accomplished brass player, organist, music educator, and transcriptionist. He is organist of the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Camden, NJ, and Band Director and Music Teacher at the Upper Pittsgrove School in Monroeville, NJ. He works side-by-side with Mr. Conte to create arrangements of popular works for organ and the unique and voluptuous sound of the flugelhorn. The duo's first CD recording, *My Heart With Thy Sweet Voice* (Gothic #G-49294) received a Critic's Choice Award from the American Record Guide in January 2016 and was described in an American Record Guide review in November 2016 as being "a stunningly beautiful program". A second CD by the duo will be released in Fall 2018. Mr. Ennis also arranges and performs with Peter Conte large-scale transcriptions of symphonic works such as Respighi's *Pines of Rome*, Rimsky-Korsokov's *Scheherazade*, and Respighi's orchestration of J.S. Bach's *Passacaglia in C minor*, for four hands and four feet at one console.

## TO MAKE CHANGES ON THE NATIONAL AGO WEBSITE:

1) Using the Internet, input the web address www.agohq.com

2) When the main AGO web page appears, scroll down to bottom of the page to a section called AGO Membership Option

3) Find ONCARD, point to it and left click your mouse

4) On the ONCARD screen, locate ONCARD Login/Review, point to it and left click your mouse

5) Look for User Name, point to it and left click

6) Enter your name as follows, first initial, no space, last name. Example, my login name is realhoun

7) Now locate password, point to it, left click and enter the five-digit membership number found on your American Organist magazine. On your mailing label, there are three sets of numbers and an expiration date directly above your name. Your member number is the third set of numbers from the left. Enter that number in the password box and click. Note that you may change your password at any time.

8) Your will now come to your personal data screen. Locate Update Personal Information, point to it and left click.

9) You will see your name. Correct it if necessary. You will also see AGO Certifications, update this field by clicking an arrow next to the field, Other Credentials (update this) and e-mail address. It is absolutely vital that e-mail be updated at all times. You will also see your birthdate. This is not necessary to complete but please keep in mind that once you reach 65, your dues decrease if AGO HQ knows your birthday.

10) Locate a Brown or Red Select bar titled View/Edit Address Information at the bottom of your screen. Point and left click.

**11)** Update your home phone number, your cell phone, home address. Locate address #2. Enter the telephone number of the church that presently employs you. Under Organization, enter the church's name and church address. To the right of your screen, you will see job title. Please enter your current title such as organist/choir director, Director of Music, choir member, music instructor, etc.

12) Address #3 allows you to enter a second church or school.

13) Locate the Brown or Red Select Bar titled View/Edit Chapter Specific Data. Point to this and left click.

14) This section asks specific questions such as are you available to substitute? Please enter this data.

**15) THIS IS VERY IMPORTANT**. Once you complete all changes and additions, locate the button on the bottom of your screen that says POST. Point to this button and left click. Hurray! You're done.


